








High-Risk Delivery Scoring

Following births in which infants were predicted to weigh less than 1500 grams at birth, are born before 32 weeks of pregnancy, or have correctable major birth defects, infants are typically cared for in a Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU). These infants usually have better outcomes if they are treated in a hospital with a NICU where an average of at least 15 infants are cared for per day ("average daily census of neonatal ICU").
