Pacific

California, Oregon, Washington, Alaska, Hawaii

Northeast

Maine, New Hampshire, Vermont, Massachusetts, Connecticut, Rhode Island, New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Maryland, Delaware, D.C.

Southeast

Virginia, West Virginia, Kentucky, Tennessee, North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, Florida, Alabama, Mississippi

South Central

Texas, New Mexico, Arizona, Louisiana, Arkansas, Oklahoma

Midwest

Ohio, Michigan, Indiana, Illinois, Wisconsin, Minnesota, Iowa, Missouri, Kansas, Nebraska, South Dakota, North Dakota

Mountain West

Montana, Wyoming, Idaho, Colorado, Utah, Nevada

Pacific

California, Oregon, Washington, Alaska, Hawaii

Rural Hospitals

Leapfrog classifies a hospital to be in an urban area if it is located in a county classified by the Office of Management and Budget as part of a Metropolitan Statistical Area (or part of a Combined Statistical Area).

Otherwise, hospitals are considered to be located in a rural area.

(See <http://www.whitehouse.gov/omb/assets/omb/bulletins/fy2009/09-01.pdf> for a list of counties included in Metropolitan Areas.) Exception: A Critical Access Hospital located in an urban county is nevertheless classified as "rural" for purposes of the Leapfrog Hospital Survey.

Perform 4 of 6 High-risk Procedures

Hospitals that perform 4 or more of the 6 high-risk surgical procedures. These will tend to be the regional, academic medical center type facilities.
