KNOWLEDGE IS POWER. BEING INFORMED HELPS YOU CATCH MEDICAL ERRORS EARLY.

QUESTIONS TO ASK YOUR DOCTOR

- When a doctor orders a test, ask the following questions:
 - Why do I need this test?
 - What will the test tell us?
 - How will the results affect my care?
 - When and how will I receive my results?

WHY DO PATIENTS NEED TO BE INFORMED?

- Tests can be done incorrectly
- The wrong test could be ordered
- The lab may mix up results
- Sometimes test results even get lost

HOW CAN PATIENTS HELP PREVENT ERRORS?

- Confirm your name and date of birth on every test and lab slip
- Ask what test is being done and why
- Ensure your doctor explains when you will receive the results and how you will be notified
- Write down the date, type of test and the name of the doctor ordering the test
- If you do not hear back within the expected timeframe, follow up with your doctor
