



2026 Leapfrog ASC Public Reporting Program Overview of Content for ASCs and Stakeholders

The Leapfrog ASC Public Reporting Program is designed to give every patient receiving care in an Ambulatory Surgery Center (ASC) access to the same life-saving information about patient safety and quality that has long been available for inpatient hospital care.

The public reporting program has three components:

CMS Public Reporting

Thirteen (13) measures from the CMS Ambulatory Surgery Center Quality Reporting (ASCQR) Program are scored and publicly reported on our Hospital and Surgery Center Ratings [website](#) to ensure that patients and family caregivers have a place to easily search for and compare thousands of facilities.

Accreditation Standards

Five (five) measures are scored and publicly reported as “Achieved the Standard” (best score) for ASCs that upload a current, valid accreditation certificate from the AAAHC or JC to highlight achievement of important patient safety standards that ASCs have earned through their rigorous accreditation process.

ASC Survey 2.0

Eight (8) additional measures, not available anywhere else, are scored and publicly reported for ASC that submit the Leapfrog ASC Survey 2.0 to highlight ASC’s progress towards achieving Leapfrog’s robust, evidence-based patient safety and quality standards.

ASCs that participate in all three components are eligible for Leapfrog’s prestigious [Top ASC Award](#), can be easily identified on our Hospital and Surgery Center Ratings [website](#) for demonstrating full transparency, and have access to free [benchmarking reports](#) to compare their performance on these national measures against other ASCs and HOPDs in their state and across the nation.
